Council Happenings

Council met on May 24, 2022

- After opening the meeting in prayer, a special blessing was shared concerning the voting day response of appreciation from our neighbors. Another blessing was shared noting that Cross Keys will be honoring Frank and Ruth Willheim's memory by continuing to plant and tend the wonderful flowerbeds that they grew near their cottage at the entrance to the Faith Circle Drive. A concern was also raised that when special recognitions are mentioned in worship and fellowship time, that a time of appreciation with those individuals would be appreciated.
- Thank you notes were shared from members who received Easter cards from the Sunday school nursery class. Additionally, Olivia's House, TenderCare, and HACC sent thank you notes for our recent St. Mark donations.
- Attendance was reviewed and noted as a bit more than last year at the same time.
- President Mike Merlo mentioned his appreciation for the unity, peace and joy that St. Mark exhibits in a world filled with division and violence.
- Pastor gave his statistical report. He mentioned that new computers have been bought to replace the 14-year-old office computers and will be set up around June 1st.
- Christian Ed. is set to begin planning for VBS during the last week of July.
- Evangelism Committee reviewed the Easter season and egg hunt. They also are planning to have a St. Mark-hosted booth at the Snack Town Festival day on July 16 and will need members to volunteer to hand out flyers and bottles of water.
- Property Committee reported that the hole beside the sidewalk at the handicap semi-circle has been filled in with dirt. Also the tree over Allegheny Ave. is in need of dead wood trimming, especially since many of the dead branches hang out over the road.
- The Finance report is on hold since the Finance Computer hard drive corrupted and needed replaced. The last backup of files will be installed on the new computer, and the last two months of transactions will be updated to allow for a report at a future date.
- Under old business, it was noted that we are so thankful for our recent hires and how Joni Gonzales and Tammy Wiseman have carried on the jobs they do so well.
- Also under old business, we noted that the Church clock that sits in the Archives room cannot go to the Hanover Historical Society since they have no room to house and display it. However the National Watch and Clock Museum in Columbia, PA, may be interested in displaying our clocks. We would have to check to see if this can be done on a loan basis, so we still keep ownership of the clocks. Council wanted to think about this possibility and seek feedback and ideas from members before acting on this plan.
- As new business, council voted to combine the summer council meetings into one and meet again on August 23rd at 5:00pm unless a special need arises. Also the September and October meeting will be combined and they will meet on October 11th at 5:00pm.




