Dear St. Markians:

I was so moved by this note, I wanted to share it with everyone.

Some sing, teach, provide leadership, play organ, piano, instruments, serve communion, clean up, change altar hangings, sew, clean, provide refreshments, plan activities, provide services.

Not any one person does it all. The one thing we all do is pray. I prayed for all of you while knitting these pocket prayer squares in thanks for all who make us what we are as a church.

I would like everyone to have one. So please take one and share one. Thank you all! - Josephine (Jo) Kuhns."

Thanks, Jo, for reminding us that we are the church, together. We are made up of many people with many gifts and purposes. Not one of us can go it alone. At times we forget this simple gift and think that we are on our own and that we must do everything alone. But that is impossible. When our metaphorical baskets are getting low and need replenished, we still have hope. We have help from God and each other. Even in moments of depression, fear, worry, anxiety, and hopelessness, that is the exact moment to remember that God is with us and has placed others into our lives to support us and be there when in need. That is the greatness of the church.

As one family, one church of God, we are there to pray and support each other in whatever ways we can, each in their own unique gifted way. Thanks, Jo, for the reminder. Thanks also to Amy Shermeyer, for seeing the emptying baskets and donating even more croquet prayer squares. Both baskets are once again full, because where one started, others now help.
