For me it was a three-story Hot Wheels garage, with red ramps running from top to bottom and an elevator right in the middle. This magical structure parked countless cars and trucks and could even wash them through rotating brushes that never used water — or actually cleaned anything for that matter. But that didn't bother me, because this toy was my entire world for a short bit back in 1975 when I was seven years old. It was all I wanted. I had seen it in the Montgomery Wards Wish Book and just knew I had to have it, or my Christmas would be ruined.

You probably had some of those memorable toys or gifts back in the day that you longed to receive; something you had seen in a store window, in a catalog, or at a friend's house. At the time they meant so much to you. Perhaps it was because of who gave them to you or what the item meant. For me, Santa's gift of the plastic, assemble-it-yourself, Hot Wheels garage was just all I could think about at that time.

Yet, looking back, I wonder whatever happened to all those toys? Did those gifts break? Did we grow out of them? Did our interest just fade, and we moved on? The excitement of a new gift that, at first, seemed so thrilling, many times is just forgotten. I am sure my longed-for plastic toy garage was quickly relegated to the pile of useless stuff in the basement and was eventually thrown out, never to be seen again.

That doesn't mean that gifts and toys that give us that thrill of receiving and giving are not important – they are. While our gifts, given and received, may be limited by time and worth, they are our small way of giving honor to the greatest gift ever given. Through these gifts we attempt to share in the joy and love expressed in the one gift that was given to all the world, that never can be lost, broken, or forgotten – Jesus, the Christ, our Immanuel.

Even before we knew we needed him or wanted his gift of love and grace, he gave it. Hundreds of years before God became the incarnate child of Bethlehem, Isaiah prophesied that a child would be born for us, a son given for us. Jesus came to give us life everlasting and win for us a place in his kingdom forever. This gift is ours forever. As we celebrate this Christmas, giving and receiving gifts, remember that one everlasting gift, Jesus our Savior. Celebrate that gift this year.

Council Happenings From November 22nd Meeting

- Meeting opened with prayer and a blessing mentioning the wonderful work the Evangelism Committee did with our first ever Bazaar and the workers who helped get the church ready for Advent and the Christmas Season.
- Thank you notes were received and noted by the Council along with a review of the minutes and the attendance records.
- Christian Education Committee discussed the continuing Sunday school classes and the upcoming decorating and card-making events in December.
- Evangelism Committee shared the info about the Fall Bazaar and the Give Thanks tree.
- Fellowship Committee discussed St. Mark *Eats* transitioning for the winter months to a lunch gathering. This will start in January. Also discussed other future events.
- Property Committee reviewed the ongoing work needed around the church and the holiday season needs.
- Worship and Music have planned the Advent services and Christmas Eve 3pm and 7pm worship. They will meet again in January to discuss the Spring Lenten season.
- Future Task Force presented their minutes and ideas that they are discussing based on the surveys taken. They meet again in December.
- HACC Board met to do business and discussed the psychological implications involved in homelessness.
- Finance Committee presented the end of October expenses vs. income report. Discussed trends toward deficit as we head into the end of the year which is a concern as we look at the 2023 budget. Council did approve presenting the proposed budget to the congregation at the annual election/budget meeting on December 11th.
- It was also noted that we WILL need to find nominations to keep a functioning Council in the new year. Other nominations are also being sought at this time.
- Council voted to have an office-use debit card for petty cash needs with a limit.
- Council decided to meet in December at a restaurant for an end-of-the-year Christmas dinner. The day and time are yet to be determined.
