

"Love the Lord, all you his saints" Psalm 31:23a



Dear Members:

In September I pondered what it means that we call ourselves Christians. In last month's Bell, I pondered what it meant that we go by the name Lutheran, especially since it was the month of Reformation. Now in November, we turn to the month of All Saints, and I wonder if we truly understand what it means to say that we are all saints of God. Every year we solemnly look back on the past year remembering and memorializing those members who have entered into God's eternal kingdom. Those are the saints we generally think about when this time of year comes rolling around. But we also teach in our faith that all of you, the baptized believers living day to day, are also the saints of God. That is a title that, as Lutheran Christians, we can confess both humbly and boldly.

Martin Luther wrote:

"We are all saints, and cursed is anyone who does not want to call themself a saint. You are far saintlier than your names...indicate. However, you do owe this not to yourself but to the will of God, who would be your Father. To call yourself a saint is, therefore, no presumption but an act of gratitude and confession of God's blessings. He who does not consider Baptism and God's Word, which you have in your heart, holy, blasphemes God very greatly. Since, then, God sanctifies you in Baptism and adorns you with this His holy Word, you must surely be holy by grace." [Luther's Works Vol. 32]

In this understanding, Luther is teaching that God, by Jesus' sacrifice and resurrection, has redeemed each one of us. By his cross we are made holy, forgiven of our sins, declared redeemed, and made a part of his eternal saints. To deny this, Luther says, is to be "cursed." That is what the Bible calls "blasphemy of the Holy Spirit," the rejection of the grace of God.

As Luther pointed out, whatever value your name is pales in comparison to the title God has given you as his saints. This bestowed sainthood reminds us that we are joined with all the believers, those past, present, and yet to come, as one before the glory of God.

So this month, the month of All Saints, let us remember those beloved saints who have died from this earthly realm and live on in God's kingdom. But also let us remember with "gratitude and confession" that we are also, by the grace of God, a part of that one body, God's one everlasting family of saints.

## Happenings and News in our Congregation

### Council Happenings From October 11<sup>th</sup> Meeting

- Meeting opened with prayer and reminder of blessings of our members and their involvement in the special services while pastor was away on vacation.
- Thank you notes were received and noted by the council along with a review of the minutes and the attendance records.
- Mike Merlo, during his President's report, again emphasized the good work and positive faith devotion of our members. The support and involvement during worship and in other ways shows we are a church ready to face the future.
- Pastor Kirk gave his statistical report and informed council of some follow-ups about individuals asking for use of the building space. Council was also reminded of the need to have nominations by November so they can go to the congregation in December.
- Christian Ed. has begun classes and is looking forward to a busy Fall and Christmas season. They meet again on October 18<sup>th</sup> at 6:00pm.
- Evangelism Committee met on October 6<sup>th</sup> and reviewed the plan of action for both the Pet Blessing event on October 8<sup>th</sup> and the Fall Bazaar on November 5<sup>th</sup>. More volunteers, donations of baked goods, and grannie's attic items are needed. Crafters have a few more days to reserve a table on a first come, first served basis. The committee meets again for final Bazaar touches on November 3<sup>rd</sup> at 3pm.
- Property Committee met on October 11<sup>th</sup> and reviewed ongoing building and grounds maintenance. The committee also reviewed the Advent/Christmas decorating schedule. Council approved the committee getting only nine wreaths this year for the outside doors, since the new electric doors at fellowship hall don't allow for much room to hang them. The committee next meets on December 13<sup>th</sup> at 9:30am.
- Worship and Music met and reviewed the Fall schedule and the upcoming Christmas schedule. They meet again on January 8<sup>th</sup> after morning worship.
- Preschool is updating the playground equipment with some newly purchased items.
- Sewing group announced that they appreciate the recent sheet donations but are still looking for helpers on Thursday mornings.
- Council reviewed and accepted the August treasurer's report noting the worrisome trend. The 2023 budget was reviewed in preparation to present to the congregation.
- Council discussed Vanco versus Venmo or other possibilities for digital donations. More info needs to be collected and reviewed as to the means and accessibility.
- The two tower clocks and their final destination were discussed and, since no feedback came back from the congregation, Council decided it would be nice to have them displayed at the National Clock and Watch museum in Columbia, PA. \
- Council decided that, instead of a petty cash, it would be best to have an office lowlimit credit card that could be used by staff only.
- Next council meeting is **November 22<sup>nd</sup>** at 5:00pm with a possible congregational meeting day of **December 11<sup>th</sup>** after morning worship.

**Nominations Sought:** The 2022 Nominating Committee (Tom Long, Pat Keefer, Susan Miller, Carol Reese) is still seeking : 3 Members to join the Congregation Council; 1 Auditor to join the Audit Committee; 2 at-large Nominating Committee Members for 2023; and 2 Representatives to 2023 Synod Assembly (one male and one female). If interested please see a member of the nominating committee.

<u>Election and Budget Congregational Meeting</u>: Our annual meeting will be held after Sunday services on **December 11<sup>th</sup>** with inclement weather make-up day of **December 18<sup>th</sup>**.

### **September Treasurer's Report**

At the end of September, we should be at 75% of our total budget. As you can see while we are keeping expenses below the budget the income is not keeping up at its level. What does help is that our investments and mission support are both doing well this year.

<u>St. Mark's Monthly Offering for Designated Needs</u> gives us an opportunity as a congregation to support specific domestic and international needs. During November, we are

given the opportunity to contribute to the **Roots for Boots** veterans aid group. The goal of Roots for Boots of New Oxford is to meet the current needs and future challenges of military families, predominantly in rural areas. This grassroots organization attempts serve, educate, and inspire. Roots for Boots is a down to earth group that offers members of the community opportunities to use their skills, talents and resources to engage, connect with and support veterans, active duty and military families in more direct and local ways.


food to donate. All the food will be given to the food bank and PAL lunch program at the Council of Churches on Carlisle Street.


