Pondering

Dear New in Christ:

Nostalgia always seems to creep into my thoughts around this time of year. As we move into yet another year, I ponder how could it possibly already be the year 2023. It seems like just yesterday that we moved into the new millennium. What happened to the 90's or 80's or even those 70's? Time just will not stand still, everything keeps changing, and fond memories slip into the past with hope for new ones still to come. I am sure, at this time of the year, you too share in those moments of nostalgia that make us look back with joy and perhaps just a bit of melancholy.

It's hard not to think of those times that have slipped by into the past: those beloved family members and friends that we miss so much; the traditions that we used to celebrate; the joys of events that happened long ago. As the new year begins, we ponder all these past thoughts, and yet in Christ we are given the opportunity to look with joy into the future of what is yet to be fulfilled. While we may have one foot in this world and the remembrances of times that have happened, we already have one foot into the new creation, where Christ is calling us to live with him forever.

Each year, one of the first holidays after the twelve days of Christmas is the Baptism of our Lord Sunday. On that day, we hear the story of the heaven's opening, the spirit descending, and the voice of God declaring that this is His Son. In that moment, the new age of the coming Kingdom of God begins. Jesus comes to open the heavens, offering salvation to all and declaring that we are God's children now and forever. Paul says in Romans that in Christ our old sinful self dies with Christ in our baptism so that we may rise a new creation. We no longer are simply people looking back at the past, but now we are given salvation to foresee the coming new life with Christ in his Kingdom. As Paul says, Christ raises us to walk in His newness of life.

Even as we look back at the past year, twenty years, or fifty years, we can, as Christians, still look ahead to the new creation that is coming. Christ was baptized into a death to take away our sins so that we may be raised with him to new life. By that baptism, by our baptisms, we are given this promise, that the best of life is yet to come in his promised resurrection. As baptized children of God, may we look forward to that great day with anticipation and joy, celebrating all that has past, but joyful in our new life in Christ. Be made new this day and seek that joy that is yet being fulfilled.

<u>Upcoming Church Worship Festivals</u> to take note of as we begin the New Year:

Sunday, Jan. 1st is the Name of Jesus Sunday:

The 8th day after Christmas and, according to Jewish laws, it would have been the day that Jesus was dedicated and named.



Thursday, Jan. 6th is Epiphany:

The day that marks the end of the 12 days of Christmas. Epiphany closes out Christmas as the day the magi visit the holy family, declaring him King and Lord.

Sunday, Jan. 8th is the Baptism of our Lord Sunday:

With the end of Christmas, we begin Jesus' ministry towards Jerusalem. And it all starts at his baptism when the heavens are opened and God declares him his Son. In this day we recall our own baptisms and God's adoption of us as his children.

Season of Epiphany: This year we will have seven weeks of Epiphany, a time to discover and declare the glory of Jesus. This season ends on Ash Wednesday, **February 22nd** as we go into Lent.

Since 1990, over \$175 million worth of canned goods and cash have been donated by over 305,000 churches and organizations around the country to help fight hunger in their own communities.
