When we bought it in 1979, the tandem-axle grain truck was state of the art. I drove it until I took an off-farm job with a social service agency. 30 plus years later the brakes were shot, the crank windows were cranky, and the motor used lots of oil. The truck was worn out, and my husband was wearing out too. Each year it was harder for him to work 12-hour shifts and wrestle the heavy tarp in the Kansas wind.

So last winter Don parked the truck on a dealer's lot. I thought I would be glad to see it go but, instead, I was sad. Our last tie to farming was gone. The truck was useless and would likely be sold for scrap iron. I felt pretty useless, too, retired now.

When we drove by the dealer a week later, the truck was gone. An Oklahoma farmer bought it to haul seed wheat.

The truck's new life helped me to remember that my activities in retirement are different but still beneficial. While I don't have the agility to paint the house roof again, I am helping Don put up drywall in the basement. My swollen thumb joints keep me from playing difficult organ preludes, but each Sunday I play hymns for our small congregation. I don't speak to large groups about justice issues, but I do visit an elderly friend in a care home.
