Dear Faithful Easter Seekers:

After going through a deceased friend's home, a neighbor recently returned some keepsakes and clippings concerning St. Mark. Included in this was a Holv week invite sent out by Rev. John Tome nearly a hundred years ago. The words in that note still call out to us today to boldly come with loving hearts to enter Holy Week:

Dear fellow Christians:

Once again we join hands with a great multitude of those who call Jesus "Lord" and rejoice in His victory over sin and death. It is the Easter Season, and our hearts are happy, and our souls are thrilled at the meaning of the Easter message to our own lives.

Palm Sunday, the day of His triumphant entry, stands at the beginning of Holy Week with its plaudits, threats, tears, and its message of Hope. Palm Sunday calls us to mind the cheering multitudes who hailed Jesus as a conquering King. It is a day of victory, but Jesus was not deceived by the words of any for He knew that, all too soon, these same followers would be shouting "Crucify Him!"

Jesus had set his feet upon the path that led to a cross-crowned Calvary. He was free from fear and indecision because of His unparalleled devotion to the will of God; and for a soul of such heroic stature there could be no turning back. The road required eyes unwavering and heart unflinching. And this Palm Sunday, Jesus would have us keep close to the events of Holy Week and thus come to Easter Day with a triumphant song in our hearts, being like Him, forgetful of self in our love for others.

Happenings and News in our Congregation

Council Happenings at February 28th meeting

March's Council Meeting notes will be included in the May newsletter, as the meeting will occur after the printing of this newsletter.

- Council opened with prayer, accepting minutes and acknowledging the blessing of the choir's strong leadership and the wonderful Ash Wednesday worship.
- Martha Lippy volunteered to be a delegate to the 2023 Synod Assembly along with Mike Noble and Pastor Kirk.
- Pastor noted that a scam text/email was circulating in his name asking for assistance to privately provide gift cards. Gift cards are never given out, and any type of email that seems suspicious should first be validated by calling the Church office before replying in any manner.
- Evangelism is working on many activities, including a new outreach method of providing "Blessing-a-Day" packets for members to use and share with others.
- Fellowship continues to plan for St. Mark *Eats* and possibly a June Progressive Dinner between a couple of churches.
- Worship and Music is planning for the Lenten and Easter Season and looking forward to other special celebrations (Music Sunday, Preschool Sunday, Mother's Day and Father's Day).
- St. Mark Preschool gave a report on finishing up the year strong and are already filling up most of the classes for next year.
- The Treasurer's report was given and, since the year started off well with the 4th quarter investments being deposited, we have a good positive beginning to the year.
- Since our September designated fund, "Sweet Charities," is dissolving, Council voted to replace the appeal fund with Habitat for Humanity, splitting donations between the York and Adams County chapters.
- The yearly parochial report to the ELCA was reviewed.
- It was also suggested the Face of the old Tower clock (if not the whole clock) be displayed at entrance.

St. Mark's Monthly Offering for Designated Needs gives us an opportunity as a congregation to support specific domestic and international needs which are predetermined by our Council each year. April's offering benefits Itete Hospital of the Konde Diocese, **Tanzania**. Of the various partners who support Konde Diocese, through the work of our Konde Medical Needs



Committee, we, as the Lower Susquehanna Synod, are the only partner providing ongoing support for the Itete Hospital. The Lutheran Hospital provides a wide variety of services such as surgery, gynecology, obstetrics and internal medicine. The hospital has OPD, an operating theatre and the following wards: male ward 32 beds, pediatric ward 29 beds, maternity 19 beds, female ward 34 beds and two isolation wards for tb and diarrheal diseases. In addition, malnourished children have their own rooms. There are also 6 dispensaries, 1 health center and 4 mobile clinics that are served from Itete. The hospital has 1 doctor, 4 clinical officers, 28 nurses and total number of staff is 80. Over 40,000 people are served form this one hospital. Please pray and support their ministry.
