Remember then from what you have fallen; repent, and do the works you did at first. Revelation 2:5a

Dear repentant faithful:

Johnny was a curious little boy, always on the lookout for something new or interesting. Often he could be seen walking along, on his way to or from school, picking up little odds and ends right out of the street. These were things that others discarded but he thought of as treasure. It didn't matter what it was: a pinecone, a bottle cap, a crushed water bottle; everything looked interesting to him. By the time he got home each day, his backpack was full of stuff he had collected that day. His mother tried insisting that he didn't need to save it all, but he just kept doing it anyway.

One day, on his way to school, little Johnny came across a construction site. The sidewalk had been jackhammered, and chucks of debris were laying everywhere. Well as you can imagine, Johnny couldn't let that opportunity pass. Emptying his backpack of his lunch and his books, he stuffed it full of the rubble. Big rocks, little rocks, colorful dust, and chunks of concrete went into his bag till it was almost ripping from the weight. Proudly, Johnny continued on to school, hauling his great treasure that he had found that day. But when class time came, he couldn't do any of his schoolwork because he didn't have his books. And without his lunch, he grew ever more hungry with each passing hour. Everyone knows, except for Johnny, even you the reader knows, it is better to have the bookwork to better the mind and the food to nourish the body than to lug around a bag of worthless rocks.

So why do we all hold on to those bags of rocks and carry them throughout our lives? We may not be named Johnny and it may not be a backpack full of concrete, but in many ways we each lug things that weigh us down; painful thoughts, hurt feelings, past mistakes. They could be moments of weakness, actions we have taken or had happen to us by others. We just keep picking stuff up and shoving it into the bag, further and further down into our being, hoping that perhaps it will get lighter or it will be forgotten.

Lent is a time of repentance. It is a time to take the backpack off and seek the freeing life of joy and peace in God. The action of repentance is a way to spiritually turn away from all those things we have collected over the years and seek the cleansing of Christ's love. This lent, think about what you have been collecting in your emotional or spiritual backpack that holds you down. Drop that attribute or characteristic that holds you down. Refrain from continuing to walk that path and seek to repent, being nourished in the Spirit of the Lord.



Proud of Our Kids! We thought it would be fun to share updates on our youth's activities:


