Dear Thankful St. Markians:

In the Fall of 1621, the indigenous Wampanoag people and the recent European English settlers came together for three days of celebration and feasting. They were coming together to mark the end of a successful harvest season. Some believe that this began the day of Thanksgiving in the United States. But it wasn't until 242 years later that President Abraham Lincoln, proclaimed the 4th Thursday of November as a national day of giving thanks. While those two events play an important role in our nation's history, neither of them marked the beginnings of giving thanks to God. That tradition goes back to the very beginning, even to the times of Noah. Genesis chapter 8 describes the first action Noah took upon leaving the ark after the flood subsided: to build an altar and offer sacrifice of thanksgiving to God. What follows in almost every book of the Bible are people, tribes, and nations all remembering to give thanks to God for life, for sustenance, for peace, for comfort, for hope, for salvation. To truly live with a thankful heart to God means more than just celebrating one day out of the year.

Even here in the church, November is marked with more than just one day of thanks. We start off the month with the festival of All Saints' to remember and honor all those who have entered into God's kingdom ahead of us, especially our own members who have died in the last year. They may have been the ones who taught us about God, who loved us and showed us God's love in how they lived their life. Until we join with them, we give thanks for this eternal hope in God.

Then of course we gather in the harvest of blessings as we head towards Harvest Home Sunday on the 19th. We gather up food that we may have in abundance to help those who do not have enough. We gather in the quilts and blankets of warmth to give to those who are cold or need comfort. We gather in the gifts of joy to give to families and children who need joy in their lives. We are blessed with so much; we give thanks by giving of our abundance so that others may also know God's love.

Finally, we will end the month on Christ the King Sunday as the last weekend of the month. We draw the church year to a close on this high festival Sunday, celebrating the one who is our Savior and grants us an everlasting place in his kingdom.

As you can see, November is so much more than just giving thanks one day. Take time to worship and give thanks *every* day. In the peace and grace of God, *Pastor Kirk Griffin* 

# Happenings and News in our Congregation

### Council Happenings: October 11, 2023

- Council opened with prayer and gave thanks for the blessings of our lay leaders who filled in while Pastor was away and for the wonderful music, especially the involvement of the children in the band, and in the Longs' singing offertory.
- Attendance and membership roll changes were reviewed.
- President Mike Merlo lifted up with optimism the goodness of our congregation as we look to move forward in God's work.
- Pastor gave his statistical report and also gave thanks for the lay support as he took his vacation. Pastor also presented to Council the recommendation from Gary Laabs and himself for the position of housekeeper after they completed the interviews. The council voted and approved that St. Mark hire Danielle Miskimon as our new Housekeeper/Custodian. Lastly, Pastor reminded the council of the nominations needed by December to fill the 4 outgoing council positions, 2 nominating committee members, 1 auditor, and 2 delegates to 2024 synod assembly.
- Christian Ed. verbally acknowledged the wonderful work and donations for this year's "God's Work. Our Hands." Sunday. It was also noted that the fall classes have begun for nursery, elementary, and confirmation.
- Evangelism is working hard to get ready for the Fall Bazaar on Nov. 4th in addition to the prayer cards, the devotionals, and other work of sharing the message of God.
- Property Committee noted the ongoing maintenance and work around the church. The heat system has been serviced and cleaned in preparation for the coming winter.
- Worship and Music reviewed the Advent/Christmas schedule. It was decided to have processionals for the upcoming Festival Sundays volunteers will be needed.
- Auxiliary groups noted the ongoing work at HACC, preschool, the sewing ladies, and that the actions of the Future Task Force Group on Tuesday, October 17<sup>th</sup> will be goal setting for 2024 and beyond, so everyone's input is needed.
- Council reviewed the August and September Treasurer's reports and noted the ongoing deficit as we move into the fall season. The proposed 2024 budget was reviewed and will be voted for final recommendation to the congregation after the next Finance Committee meeting.
- Council discussed Bishop James Dunlop's Finance Integrity letter asking congregations to be attentive to good management of auditing practices in light of several issues throughout the synod recently. It was noted we already diversify the roles of finance, and the Audit Committee will meet to review the year.
- Having no other business, the council adjourned until next month.

**Nominations Sought:** We are seeking: 4 Members to serve three-year terms on Council; 1 Auditor to serve a three-year term; 2 Nominating Committee Members for a one-year term; and 2 Delegates to the 2024 Synod Assembly. Please talk with a Council member if interested.

<u>Election and Budget Congregational Meeting</u>: Our annual meeting will be held after Sunday services on **December 10**<sup>th</sup> with inclement weather makeup day of **December 17**<sup>th</sup>.






### St. Mark's Giving Trees


