Dear Good-News-Spreading Christians:

As the night settled on the hills outside Bethlehem, a few shepherds were bedded down for the night, reclining by the fire for warmth, while one or two took their turns watching over the herds. It was just another night for them, nothing special, nothing extraordinary. They definitely didn't anticipate that night that they would see the Glory of God fill the skies and the messengers of heaven proclaiming the birth of the Messiah.

Yet this is exactly what St. Luke tells us happened outside of Bethlehem in the darkness of that evening. After they saw this extraordinary sight, they went and witnessed firsthand the baby Jesus, just as it had been proclaimed to them. From that moment on, they went forth "spreading the word concerning what had been told them about this child." These ordinary, uneducated, hardworking shepherds of the fields became the very first human messengers of the Good News of Jesus Christ.

That is the Christmas Gift, the news that God has been born into creation and lived to take upon his shoulders our sins and free us from death itself. That message still needs to be shared with a world that is filled with anxiety and unease, pain and sadness. Too many people still live without hope, not knowing the true gift that comes at Christmas and is fulfilled at Easter. This message needs to be proclaimed, concerning all that has been told to us about the child, Jesus, our Messiah and Lord.

On the first page of this newsletter is an invitation. You can separate it from the rest of this newsletter and use it to give to someone else. It is there to empower you to become one of those messengers of the good news of Jesus Christ, just as the shepherds were so long ago. You can give it to a friend, a neighbor, a relative – anyone that the Spirit moves you to share it with, especially at this time of year. There is not a better time to become a messenger of the Lord, sharing our church and the good news of Jesus with the World. This Christmas, become like the shepherds, a joyful messenger of the Lord.

Happenings and News in our Congregation

Council Happenings: November 28, 2023

- Council opened with prayer and gave thanks for the blessings of recent ministry events (the Bazaar, the Election Day Preschool Bake Sale, the Advanced Directive Workshop) and the upcoming events (Garden Club Sale, Blood Drive, Advent, and Christmas Celebrations). It was also noted how wonderful the quilts and the donations of toys and food filled the sanctuary recently. And finally, the news of our most recent new baby into the church family was celebrated.
- Attendance and membership roll changes were reviewed.
- President Mike Merlo restated all the blessings and good news as we move forward.
- Pastor gave his statistical report. It was also suggested and approved by Council that the CPIC scheduled each week would also become one of the communion assistants for that same service. Pastor also reviewed the nominations needed for the congregational meeting. Pastor informed the council of the heating issue with Boiler 2 and the fix that will be needed in the coming days. Finally, Council discussed a memorial gift and made suggestions for its use in the church ministry.
- Under Committee reports, the only one that was noted especially was the Worship and Music Committee review and plans for the upcoming Christmas season. The step-by-step decorating plan through Advent was reviewed and is being worked on.
- Auxiliary groups noted the ongoing work at HACC, preschool, the sewing ladies, and that the actions of the Future Task Force Group are steadily moving forward.
- Council reviewed the October Treasurer's report and noted the ongoing deficit as we head into our final months of the year.
- Old Business was reviewed concerning the Bishop's Finance Integrity letter. Our Audit team has met and will be finalizing the review of last year's books before the end of the year. Also, we noted the positive reception and good work of our newest hired housekeeper Danielle Miskimon
- In new business it was noted that the Annual meetings are scheduled: Election/Budget Meeting will be December 10th, and the Year-in-Review meeting will be February 11th, 2024.
- Council discussed having their next meeting as a Christmas Dinner event to be planned for the first week of January.
- Having no other business, the council adjourned until January.




