"When the day of Pentecost came,

they were all together in one place." Acts 2:1

"Those who accepted [the] message were baptized,

and about three thousand were added to their number that day." Acts 2:41

Dear Gathered St. Markians:

Look at what happened between the first verse and the last verse of chapter two of Acts of the Apostles as written in the passages above. The followers of Jesus multiply from just a handful of faithful to over 3,000 baptized believers in one day. That is the power of the Holy Spirit at work in those believers and their ability to trust in God working through them to others.

For almost six weeks, the disciples are reunited with Jesus after his sacrificial death and burial. He is now the risen, victorious Lord. By his living presence he shows them his glory in the Easter appearances. But on the fortieth day, Jesus leads his small band of followers outside the city of Jerusalem, and there he gives them his final commands. He tells them to remain in Jerusalem, explaining, "you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you; and you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." (Acts 1:8). So these disciples remain in Jerusalem awaiting that gift Jesus has promised. We know from that chapter they only numbered about 120 in total, made up of the 12 disciples, the women and the others who had followed Jesus.

But on the festival day of Pentecost, as they gather together in the same place, the Spirit comes upon them in a sudden rush of fire and wind, filling them with power to become the evangelists, as Jesus promised to "ends of the earth." They go forth from that room, that place of gathering, that worship space, and begin to tell others about Jesus. They tell them in words that they understand, in emotional ways that share their feelings, in hope that people long for in life. And in that one day, 3,000 people became believers.

Each one of us is still called by Jesus to receive that same Spirit. Each week we gather here at St. Mark and worship together, we hear the scriptures and pray together, just as that small group of disciples did so long ago. But we also are called on to leave this place and share that message with others. To invite them by our own story of our understanding of faith. We are still God's evangelists, given the mission to pick up that mission to "the ends of the earth." Let's begin right here in Hanover. In the peace and grace of God, *Pastor Kirk Griffin*


The dining time for Fratelli's still needs planned, so please be sure to watch for upcoming announcements in the Wednesday updates and/or weekend bulletin handouts.
