Dear Church:

While the original meaning of the word “church” is a gathering of people of faith, St. Mark is so much more. But through Jesus’ life, death, and resurrection, we are given the grace of God – the grace that bestows on us the redemption of our souls, that makes us right again with God, that cleanses us and states that we are invited and welcome to the Kingdom of God. So as foundational as this gift of grace is, we are to always be about developing it, learning more about it, living in it; in other words, “Growing in Grace.” And through that grace we “Impact the World” by living as ambassadors of God, connecting others to the same grace of our Lord.

So, let’s all be about fulfilling that purpose. This month as we return to our fall season, may we all be about **GGIW!**

We fulfill this by: Nurturing our relationship with God and others.


Spreading God's love by inviting others to experience God through our lives.



Getting Ready for the 2023-2024 School Year


Where did the summer go? It seems like it was only a week ago that we were celebrating the preschool's Class of 2023. Now, we are ready to open our doors once again to a new group of students.
