Dear Lenten Praying Faithful:

Another Lenten season is about to come upon us. Yes, I know it seems like we just got through Advent and Christmas, but Lent, in fact, does begin early this year on February 14th. We will mark that day with our usual Ash Wednesday worship service with Holy Communion and imposition of Ashes. But Lent is more than one day; it is forty days set aside for a time of reflection and preparation. It is a time to pray, read the Word of God, and contemplate on your dedication to the faith.

Early in 1535, Peter Beskendorf, a long time barber and friend of Martin Luther, was contemplating his own spiritual life and so asked Luther how one goes about praying. Luther responded with a letter to his friend encouraging him to pray using the foundations of our faith and, as the psalmist says, pray often, day and night. This is the goal of all Christians, but so often we fall short in our prayer life. Luther himself admits that it is hard to sustain a meaningful prayer life in this world filled with distractions, temptations, and so many mundane tasks. And yet, he still was encouraged to seek those times of prayer no matter where his life led him. He used and suggested a four-step method to prayer: instruction, thanksgiving, confession, and requests. First, begin with listening to the instructions of what God has taught us in the commandments and creeds. Then remember to give thanks for all the blessings God has given you. Third, confess your faults, sins, and weaknesses so that you may finally end with requests for guidance, help, health, strength, and needs for others. This simple four-step prayer life can be done by all.

In Lent we are given a time to make a new start, to turn and begin with a simple plan of forty days of prayer: committing ourselves to growing our spiritual life and seeking to spend time talking and listening to God. Prayer is one of the disciplines of Lent that anyone can do, even a barber, even us. This Lenten Season, join us as we use Luther's "A Simple Way to Pray" letter as our basis for the Wednesday night Soup and Study discussions. If you can't join us on Wednesday nights, try your best to follow this method and make a resolve to pray often.

Happenings and News in our Congregation

Council Meeting Happenings: January 23, 2024

- The Council met with prayer and blessings. This past Advent and Christmas Season was mentioned as a blessing, giving thanks to all those who participated, decorated, worshipped, and took part in making it a wonderful season of the year. Council also gave thanks to our snow-shoveling people who have done great keeping our walks and parking lot open in the last two weeks.
- Elections for Council Officers were held. Mike Merlo accepted President, Penelope Highlands accepted Vice President, Martha Lippy accepted Secretary, and Kathy Gates accepted the Treasurer position. Thanks were given for their willingness to serve another year in these positions.
- Minutes, attendance, membership changes were noted and reviewed by Council.
- Council selected representatives to the various committees: Christian Ed Hollis Long; Evangelism Martha Lippy; Fellowship Hunter Shaw; Finance Mike and Gail Merlo; Preschool Martha Lippy and Kathy Gates; Property Gail Merlo; Social Ministry still vacant; Worship and Music Penelope Highlands and Alex Spalding.
- President Mike Merlo gave his beginning-of-the-year inspirational speech, reminding the council that we are the church together and with God's help we will continue to tackle new ministries and continue our traditions.
- Pastor gave his statistical report reminding the council of their previous approvals of new members and baptisms during the Council Christmas dinner. Pastor also noted that we still need a male delegate to Synod Assembly which now has been moved to St. Matthew's Lutheran in York on Saturday, June 1st.
- Evangelism Committee gave its report, summing up the Fall Bazaar and advertising for the Christmas Season. Prayer cards were sent out but there is still a need to be informed of addresses by people placing the names on the prayer lists. Inspiration card envelopes will continue in the new year. And, finally, the committee is seeking new ways to advertise now that the Merchandiser is no longer published.
- Fellowship Committee reported on the upcoming St. Mark *Eats* events and Fellowship events for the first half of the year. The committee now meets for fellowship, dinner, and planning together and invites anyone to join them.
- Property Committee reported that the heat system needed a new little pump for Boiler 2 which has been installed, and, finally, the entire system seems to be running smoothly. Other items addressed: light box in parking lot was fixed, backpack vacuum was fixed, suppression unit alarm is working despite inspectors claim, spackling and painting needs finished in dishwasher room, and various ongoing other property needs.
- Future Task Force group reported that they are reviewing several ministry concepts and are beginning in February with the initial Messy Church idea to develop community awareness and fellowship.
- Preschool report was given showing the positive current financial picture of our preschool. Registrations are open, and the morning 4-year-old class is already full.
- Council approved the 2024 monthly Designated Funds list as the same as 2023.
- Council voted to have their next meeting at 4:00PM on Tuesday, February 27th.

Provide-A-Lunch Team #2 will be serving at HACC on February 25th: Our primary team members include: Joann Berwager, Dale Dull, Shellene Griffin, Lynn Gross, and Liz Robinson.

PAL is an important program hosted by HACC to make sure local people in need get at least one hot meal per day, 365 days a year. To maintain our three teams, we can use more PAL volunteers. Each team

only serves **once every three months**, so it's not a huge time commitment. Any help is appreciated. Call or just come to one of our serving events at HACC on Carlisle Street.

HACC NEWS & SPECIAL NEEDS THIS MONTH:

PAL (Provide-a-Lunch) Program: Cans of mixed vegetables, corn, green beans, potatoes, butter, sugar, milk, snacks, scalloped potatoes, fruit cups, peanut butter, grocery/shopping bags.

Ruth's Harvest: Single-serve entrees, single-serve fruit cups, single-serve cereals, single-serve granola bars.

Clothing Bank: Children/teen clothing (all sizes), men's jeans waist sizes 30-34, shoes/sneakers, grocery/shopping bags.

Shelter: Hygiene products and toiletries (shampoo, conditioner, soap, body wash), Clorox wipes, kitchen trash bags, and Ziploc bags (sandwich and gallon).

Meals on Wheels: Throw blankets, adult coloring books, colored pencils, word search books, compression socks, handkerchiefs, box tissues.
