"...his disciples said to him, 'Where do you want us to go and make the preparations for you to eat the Passover?' " Mark 14:12b



Dear Easter-Anticipating Christians:

Are you ready? Easter is coming! We may still be in Lent, but Easter Sunday is coming! We may still be in the bleakness of winter, but we know the joy of new life is coming. We may still be in the world, but we know the kingdom of the resurrection glory, that promise of Easter is coming. The new day has begun. Are you ready?

The disciples knew the yearly festival of Passover was at hand, and so they asked where Christ wanted to prepare for the festival meal. For over 1300 years, families and friends had gathered yearly to remember the event that had freed them from slavery in Egypt and to give thanks to God. They marked it with a meal that symbolized their struggle, the bitter taste of slavery, the sweetness of freedom, and the hope of a better day that is still to come. Each year as these families and friends gathered, they prepared while looking back with thanks and looking ahead in hope of a great new day.

Those disciples had prepared for the meal just as the people had for over a thousand years. But on this Thursday night at this meal, things were different. Jesus picked up the bread and the final cup of Passover and blessed them, saying that He was giving His body and His blood for all people. He became the sacrificial lamb whose blood marked us as free from death, God's people, redeemed and a part of the new day.

That new day came early on Sunday morning, as an angel in dazzling clothes sat in the place where they had laid the body of the crucified Jesus, and he announced to the world that "He is risen, He is not here." The new day had begun, the time of salvation was at hand. The day that humanity had been preparing for since the fall from grace had taken place. The new great day had come. Easter had arrived.

Despite the fact that it is still Lent, that the calendar tells us that only on the last day of the month is it Easter; despite us still struggling in the day-to-day worldly business of life, we are already a part of the promised resurrection victory. That day has begun, that day of joy and blessedness is being fulfilled. Be ready, prepare your hearts and minds, and celebrate in all ways the joy of knowing and living in the promise of the Risen Lord. Happy Easter!

Happenings and News in our Congregation

Council Meeting Happenings: February 27, 2024

- The Council met with prayer and blessings.
- Minutes, attendance, membership changes were noted and reviewed by Council, giving thanks for the recent baptisms and the next one that is planned.
- President Mike Merlo challenged the council to prayer. He reminded them that the world is filled with so much pain and anguish right now that we need the Lord more than ever. Only God has the power to help and renew, so he asked that the council pray for this renewal, this cleaning, and for the congregation of St. Mark to be ready to minister to those in need.
- Pastor gave his statistical report. Pastor noted that we still need a male delegate to Synod Assembly which now has been moved to St. Matthew's Lutheran in York on Saturday, June 1st. It was also noted that we have an ongoing janitorial supply issue since our last supply company sold. He also submitted the yearly ELCA parochial report reminding the council that one of their duties is yearly review of membership rolls and budget which make up the parochial reports sent to the national church body.
- Evangelism Committee gave its report, stating that five prayer cards were sent in January to individuals on the prayer list. If those who submitted the names to the prayer list were able to communicate contact info, we could probably send more cards of support and prayers. The committee also discussed implementing the "God's Glory" card program. The hope is to have different Godly moments recorded on note cards and displayed for others to see in the hallway by the end of the year 2024.
- Property Committee is dealing with the ongoing upkeep of the building and the necessary needs of our grounds. The major issue this month was getting a new supplier to supply janitorial needs that match our equipment. It is proving to be a difficult endeavor so far.
- Worship and Music Committee reviewed the Advent and Christmas season as they also prepared for the Lent and Easter Season. Topics discussed were the ongoing needs for worship helpers during and following worship. Liturgy settings were determined for Lent, Easter, and Pentecost. Preschool Sunday was set for April 7th and Music Sunday was set for May 12th.
- Future Task Force reviewed the three 2024 priorities that were set: Messy Church event, Hero Event, and Expanding our Online footprint. It was encouraged of leaders to pray and think about the possibilities of online worship, meetings, functions available through the church and what it would mean to our community. Gary Laabs is gathering feedback and thoughts on this topic.
- Finally, Council discussed financial matters and concerns.






