Pastor's Ponderings

Dear Vacationing St. Markian: The calendar says we are leaving the month of June and entering July – that's summer. Just last week we had the "He said to them, 'Come away to a deserted place all by yourselves and rest a while.' For many were coming and going, and they had no leisure even to eat." MARK 6:31

longest day of the year, with fifteen hours of sunshine beaming down on us – that's summer. The weather is hitting the upper nineties with heat indexes above one hundred degrees – that's summer. Humidity levels have spiked above 70% with swampy stickiness – that's summer. Yes, it's summer – if you have not noticed yet, we are definitely in the hot summer season.

Despite all that summer brings with the heat and humidity, it is still the time of year for relaxing and vacationing. It is the time of year to go down to the seashore and sit on the warm beach, or to ascend to the coolness of the mountains, or to relax on the deck by a babbling creek. Summer is that time of year when we take a moment and break away from our daily routines and seek the calmness of rest.

Having spent some very busy days, Jesus, healing and teaching throughout Galilee, sends his own disciples out two-by-two to teach about his Kingdom and to heal, casting out unclean spirits. As the quote above from St Mark says, once they return from their missions, Jesus insists that they come away to find a place alone to rest. Jesus himself knows the importance of this time away, to renew and to refresh our spirit and body.

Following in our Lord's example, we seek that same pattern in our lives – embracing this time of the year and seeking to restore ourselves in peace, body and spirit. Yet notice that when the disciples went off alone to renew, they still were with Jesus, they were with the Lord. Vacations can be changes to our daily lifestyles and entertaining, refreshing adventures, but no matter where we are, we must be with the one who gives us rest and life. Even in worship, we have that opportunity to leave behind the day-to-day hecticness of our lives and enter into the renewing presence of God. Working or sleeping, driving or hiking, shopping or sitting watching tv, is not the same as being actively in worship. Take that time, as Jesus said, to come away to renew and refresh, to worship the Lord and give thanks for your life. Let us always remember in this hot summer season, to find time to relax, renew, and refresh with the Lord.

LOWER SUSQUEHANNA SYNOD ASSEMBLY UPDATE: MAY 31st – JUNE 1st, 2024

- Registered: 444 voting members, of which 251 were lay voting members and 193 were rostered ministers from congregations and agencies throughout the synod.
- Welcomed the Rev. Phil Hirsch, Executive Director of Christian Community and Leadership (USA) of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America, as churchwide representative, and received greetings from him.
- Re-elected Jennifer R. Lau as Synod Vice President for a second term.
- Received report of the 2023 Generosity Appeal and thanks from Hope Academy and Tree 4 Hope for the support from the 2023 Generosity Appeal.
- Received greetings from United Lutheran Seminary in both an address by the Rev. Dr. Martin Otto-Zimmann and video greetings from the Rev. Dr. R. Guy Erwin.
- Adopted the Fiscal Year 2025-26 budget of \$2,606,708.28.
- Adopted the 2025 minimum salary guidelines for Ministers of Word and Sacrament and Ministers of Word and Service.
- Launched the 2024 Generosity Appeal to benefit the construction of the new hospital in Mbeya, Konde Diocese, Evangelical Lutheran Church in Tanzania.
- Elected individuals to the Synod Council. Nominated individuals to the ELCA Church Council for election at the 2025 Churchwide Assembly. Elected voting members to represent our synod at the 2025 ELCA Churchwide Assembly in Arizona.
- Welcomed Jennie Wolf Smith from GSB Fundraising and received her presentation on our synod's stewardship initiative, "Building a Culture of Generosity."
- Received updates from this synod's Mission Committee regarding the 2025 bishop election process that will unfold over the next year, including a call to prayer and schedule of listening sessions. The listening

sessions are an opportunity for you to share how the Spirit is calling us, as synod, to prepare the "Synod Mission Profile" and "Gifts of a Bishop" documents that will serve as educational tools for our congregations in preparing for the election. Two near Hanover will be:

- Sunday, August 4th, 2024, 2-4pm at United Lutheran Seminary, Gettysburg Campus, Aberly Room 61, Seminary Ridge, Gettysburg
- Sunday, September 15th, 2024, 2-4pm at Trinity Lutheran Church, 6 York St, Codorus (Jefferson), PA
- Adopted the motion to amend continuing resolution S9.04.A23 "Preliminary Identification Process Leading to the Election of a Bishop."
- Amended and adopted a resolution submitted by the Synod Council requiring LGBTQIA+ cultural competency for rostered leaders every two years and recommending additional training for the LSS-ELCA congregations.
- Received a presentation and report from the Equity Audit Task Force.
- Amended bylaw S10.07.07. related to the Personnel Committee.
- Installed newly elected members of Synod Council and conference secretaries.
- Received worship offering of \$7,513.25 in support of the 2024 Generosity Appeal.
- 2025 Synod assembly is set for June 5th, 6th, and 7th, 2025, at St. Matthew Evangelical Lutheran Church, York, Pennsylvania.


