# Pastor's Ponderings

Jesus said to his followers:

"Store up for yourselves
treasures in heaven."

St. Matthew 6:20A

Dear Harvesting Faithful, We have squirrels at church. My goodness, do we have squirrels at church! They are everywhere, darting here and there, climbing

across this branch or up that tree. Several times now, I have noticed one particular squirrel, cheeks full of acorns, running from the church yard directly across Willow Street. The squirrel then goes into a bush by the house at the corner of Allegheny and Willow. Then he comes right back, cheeks empty, looking for more nuts to gather. I know that squirrels get ready for winter by stocking up on nuts. It is in their nature to gather and store up for themselves what they will need, so when the wind turns cold and the frozen ground becomes hard, they are ready.

Now if you stop and think about it, we are just like that squirrel. In many ways, we spend a lifetime getting ready for something that is coming. It is in our nature. We know that today will not last and that tomorrow is right around the corner. Yet we cannot fully comprehend what tomorrow will bring, let alone the next hour. So we prepare ourselves, getting ready for the possibilities of what may come. We store up our food, our comforts, our finances, our friendships, our memories, and all kinds of stuff just to make sure we are ready for something that is coming but yet still unseen.

According to Matthew's Gospel, Jesus tells his followers not to work toward possessing things of this world but, rather, store up the treasures of heaven. All riches and worldly possessions cannot last. We know that eventually we cannot hold on to our earthly things, but there is one thing that we can possess forever, the final victory of the resurrection in Jesus Christ and his eternal home. This is the one certainty we know is coming soon by the grace of God for all of us who believe.

This is what we work toward and celebrate this All Saints', remembering loved ones who have received that promised victory of peace in God's presence. This is why we show our outpouring of gifts of time and talent by laying out the quilts in the sanctuary. This is why we give of our possessions by donating boxes and cans of food for those who are struggling in need.

Come to think of it, perhaps we are a bit different from the squirrel. It gathers only for tomorrow. We live always towards God, knowing that tomorrow is taken care of in the promise of Christ. Give thanks this month for all that you have been given

# HAPPENINGS AND NEWS IN OUR CONGREGATION



- Council met on Tuesday, October 15<sup>th</sup>, at 4:00pm, beginning with prayer.
- Council gave blessings for being back in the sanctuary after our two months in the fellowship hall. Noted that worship in the fellowship hall was very well-received because everyone sat together verbalizing well the liturgy and the hymns.
- Received a thank you letter from HACC regarding St. Mark donation to the Ruth's Harvest ministry.
- Council reviewed and approved the August Council meeting minutes and the attendance and membership roll changes.
- Council President Mike Merlo gave his report expressing a big thanks to the members who continue to support physically and financially the ministry of St. Mark in Hanover and beyond.
- Pastor gave his statistical report. He also noted that the Nomination Committee will need to begin assembling a slate of nominees for the December congregation meeting.

- 3 or 4 Council Members
- 1 Audit Committee Member
- 2 Nomination Committee Members
- 2 Delegates (1 Female & 1 Male) to 2025 Conference and Synod Assembly

Pastor also shared two letters from the Synod:

- 1) Bishop Dunlop asks for prayer in calmness and peace in these conflicted times
- 2) Synod Treasurer reported that congregational filing and updates will only be available online from now on.

- Evangelism Committee reported on their last meeting, noting current prayer cards sent, advertising issued, Pet Blessing event, and plans for the Fall Bazaar on November 2<sup>nd</sup> from 8:00am to 2:00pm.
- Property Committee reported on continuing list of needed repairs and upcoming items that need addressed around the church grounds. It was noted also that the heating system had its fall service check and then had issues a week later. These loose pipes are being addressed and will be corrected soon.
- Worship and Music Committee reviewed previous worship events and needs. They made plans for upcoming special days: Reformation, All Saints', and Christ the King Sundays.
- HACC Board minutes and the agenda plans for the A/C Task Force were reviewed by Council.
- Treasurer's report was detailed noting the higher expenses as we finished the summer. The 2025 proposed budget will be sent digitally to each Council member for review ahead of their next meeting so it can be presented to the congregation in December.
- Council approved the request from the UPMC Auxiliary group to host another jewelry sale in the fellowship hall in the Spring of 2025.
- Next Council meeting will be **November 19**<sup>th</sup>, at 4:00pm. All are welcome to attend.

# UPMC Health Fair Day in St. Mark's Fellowship Hall


# November 9<sup>th</sup>, 1:00pm to 3:00pm

# **News from St. Mark Preschool**

### **Fire Safety**


