Pastor's Ponderings

"Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through the fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you. For I am the Lord your God..." Isaiah 43:1b-3a Dear The Named of God:

Do you know your name? Probably all of you would be able to answer that question. At least I think that I could safely assume that everyone reading this month's "Pastor's Ponderings" is able to identify his or her own name. After all, it happens

frequently in our lives, perhaps while in a crowd – someone you may know calls out to you. In that moment, your ears hear the vocalization of the familiar sound, your mind translates the vocalization as a personal call to you, and physically you turn your head or body towards that call. This is just our automatic reaction that has been ingrained in us from our youngest years. We hear, we recognize, and we turn to listen. This is the same way God speaks with us every day, if we just open our ears, recognize the Lord's voice, and turn and listen.

Isaiah prophesies in the above quote that God has told him that he knows us and that we are his own. In fact, he declares that God is calling us by our name and is with us each day even when we pass through the waters and through the fires of life. To his listeners in Judah, in the 8th century B.C., these words would conjure images of a time before they were a nation, back during the times of Moses. God had called his children from captivity in Egypt and led them by the pillar of smoke through the waters of the Red Sea and by the pillar of fire through the wilderness to the promised land, a place that became their nation. Now centuries later, Isaiah is reminding the people of Judah that God will do it again. That despite the fires and floods, the turmoil, and problems of the world, God is still calling them to follow. All they have to do is open their ears, recognize the Lord, and turn back and listen to him, and they will be restored.

As we begin a new year, we have that same message coming to us through the centuries from long ago. A message that still gives life and restores us everlasting in hope. In this new year, be moved by Isaiah's words to open your ears to God, recognizing the voice of God that is all around you and turn and listen seeking that assurance and peace in your life now and forever.

HAPPENINGS AND NEWS IN OUR CONGREGATION

Council News

Council did not meet in December but will meet **January 8th** for a gathering.

Notes from Congregational Budget/Election Meeting December 1st, 2024

- The meeting was opened with an opening prayer dialogue lead by Pastor Kirk Griffin.
- The agenda was moved and seconded, and all were in favor of its adoption.
- The minutes of the last meeting on February 11th, 2024 were presented and approved.
- Elections were held with nominees taken from the committee and from the floor at the meeting:

-Kate Klunk, Martha Lippy, Hunter Shaw all accepted to serve a term on Council. -Pennie Highlands accepted to serve a term on the Audit Committee.


-Hollis Long and Gail Merlo accepted to serve on the 2025 Nominating Committee along with the outgoing council members.

-Shellene Griffin accepted to represent the church as the female delegate to the 2025 Synod Assembly. Mike Noble was nominated to serve as the male delegate to the 2025 Synod Assembly.

- The 2025 proposed budget was presented, noting one correction to the 2024 Mutual Ministry committee totals. The budget was moved and seconded, and all were in favor of its adoption.
- President Mike Merlo presented the Sanctuary Air Conditioning Task Force findings.
 - Several companies that were contacted were not interested in bidding or it was beyond their capacity to handle.
 - One company gave a bid of over \$230,000 to replace the unit and bring it up to modern freon codes and equipment.
 - Another company gave a verbal response that it would be well over \$200,000 if interested in getting bid.
 - Walton & Company was contacted on recommendation of Baird Heating and Cooling (our usual local A/C techs). Walton examined our system and verbally told us it would be easily over \$200,000 to replace. They proposed fixing the current system at the cost of \$26,008 plus any new refrigerant costs. This would entail a new outside compressor, one fan motor and blade, and the installation of an ICM 3 phase monitor. The current refrigerant would be cleansed with new refrigerant added as needed.

The Congregation moved and seconded to approve the proposal to fix the A/C unit, accepting the Walton & Company proposal. The motion passed unanimously.

• The Congregational meeting was adjourned and the dismissal and postlude followed.
