Dear Worshipping St. Markians: I'm making a confession to all you readers of the *Bell* and worshipers of St. Mark. For several years now,

during this era of main-line church Common Lectionary, I have been misleading you as your pastor. While each week we follow prescribed scripture readings for every appointed weekend following that Common Lectionary, there is one Sunday each spring where you'll hear other scripture readings. That one Sunday is Palm Sunday.

Yes, I confess that, while the entire international main-line churches have all gone to calling that last Sunday before Easter "Passion Sunday," I still refer to it as "Palm Sunday." Sometime in the late sixties and early seventies of the last century, the world church community all decided that more and more people were not coming to worship during Holy Week to hear the passion story. So, they adjusted the calendar and renamed Palm Sunday the newer name, Passion Sunday, so that the entire Passion story would be read from Jesus' ride into Jerusalem to his last week, the last supper, his betrayal, his trial, his crucifixion, death, and burial. Now the celebration of the waving and blessing of the Palms is relegated to the opening lines of the Passion service so that, after the first hymn, the reader can move on to the last supper and the crucifixion. But I have more confidence in you as worshippers of God.

We will gather to celebrate the events of Palm Sunday and Holy Week, taking the time to walk each day with Christ as he heads toward the cross. We will come together on Palm Sunday and hear the events of that day and what occurs as Jesus comes into the temple riding triumphant into Jerusalem. We will gather again to worship on Thursday and join Jesus around that Passover table as he blesses the bread and lifts up the wine, saying "this is my body," "this is my blood," given for you. We will return, entering the darkness of Friday, and solemnly witness the betrayal and denial, the trial, and the crucifixion. We will see the light return as creation is restored in the readings of the Easter Vigil on Saturday night. Then, finally, we will celebrate the joy of the empty grave, worshipping our Lord and Risen Savior on Easter.

I confess that I can't and will not relegate all the glory of God's gift of life over death into one Passion Sunday. Instead, we will walk with Christ through the entire week in worship, witnessing the Passion of Christ. Rejoice, Easter Is Coming!

HAPPENINGS AND NEWS IN OUR CONGREGATION

Congregational Council Happenings - March 23rd

- Council met on Sunday, March 23rd, following morning worship.
- Council gave thanks and blessings to the individuals who have kept the church grounds and sign looking good the last few months.
- Council discussed the February Treasurer report as presented. Expenses this year are a bit ahead of budget but they are offset by a good investment level of income from the endowment. AC repair costs need to be expended this Spring when the repairs are completed.
- Council approved minutes, attendance, and rolls.
- A thank you from Habitat for Humanity for contributions was received and noted.
- Council President Mike Merlo gave thanks for the abilities and talents our members share in the ministry of St. Mark, noting how God provides a way when needs arise.
- Pastor gave his statistical report. He also noted that the AC unit will be scheduled for repair hopefully soon in April. Council was also informed that the PA Department of Agriculture inspector said that we really don't need the license inspection of our large kitchen, since we use it less than three days a year for income projects or events. Council agreed and will seek a temporary certificate if the need ever arises.
- Christian Education gave a report noting the volunteers needed to finish out the Sunday School year and the plans for Vacation Bible School.



- Evangelism reported that a coloring group fellowship will be open to the public once a month starting in April and that we have begun looking at plans for the 250th anniversary of the U.S. in 2026.
- Fellowship gave their listing of events and ideas for the upcoming months.
- Property reviewed the current needs list and the ongoing projects. Thanks was noted for the hospital's inclusion of our entrances in their snow removal responsibilities.
- Preschool Board gave their report, giving thanks for all the support in recent fundraisers. It was suggested that the church work on ways to integrate our preschool families more into the life of the church. One way is Preschool Sunday, which comes up on April 27th. Staffing was also discussed, noting the wonderful job and reputation our preschool codirectors / teachers have in the community.
- Council received and approved a note that the Heroes Event in May will be seeking offerings and donations to offset expenses of groups and bands that attend.
- Council will meet again after worship and preschool fellowship on Sunday, April 27th.




News and Happenings in Our Community




