Show yourself... A model of good deeds... – TITUS 2:7

I signed up for duty at a children's hospital in Manhattan with hopes of saving the world – only to discover I was the world's worst volunteer. Every Tuesday night, I joined twenty other women to lead craft time for young kids who lived at the hospital year-round. My sheltered, Alabama childhood had certainly not prepared me to work with city kids from broken homes. I colored and painted with them, but their emotional outbreaks and battles for our attention made me a nervous wreck. I didn't know how to reach out to them – even hugging was against the rules because most of the children had been abused. After a few months of failing to connect, I was just about ready to give up. Surely, someone else could love them better than I.

On what was to have been my last night, eight-year-old Victor wanted help drawing a tiger. "Please, somebody," he pleaded, as one by one the volunteers turned him down. "How about you?" He stood right in front of me with a brown crayon. I didn't want him to be disappointed, but it was only fair to warn him: "It won't be perfect, Victor."

He frowned and pointed right between my eyes. "Nothing in life is perfect, but you have to try." I looked at that child, whose life had been anything but perfect, and knew he was right. I might never be the best volunteer, but I could be a willing one. So I tried. And for weeks to come, a goofy tiger with a lopsided grin hung over my favorite second-grader's bed.
