"O God, from my youth you have taught me and I still proclaim your wondrous deeds. So even to old age and grey hairs...I proclaim your might." Psalm 71:17-18

Dear St. Mark:

The bell started to ring. At first it was a single little peal of a sound, but the tones began to build as the rocking of the cradle pulled the

bell back up and down. The clapper struck repeatedly, ringing out loudly and clearly, before fading away into the neighborhood. I had heard the call to worship on Sunday morning. The problem was, I was in my hospital room across the street. It tore at me a bit that the invite to worship had been made but I could not be present. I could not come and join together with St. Mark in prayer, to praise the Lord, hearing scripture and receiving the sacrament of Holy Communion. The bell had done its job, it announced the invitation to worship.

What a gift we have to share with the world. To ring out that invite of peace and grace that overcomes all despair, sickness, worry, or fear. That bell had done its job: I had been reminded by its call, even while laid up in a hospital bed, that there is one all-loving Father who cares for me and gives me hope.

When was the last time you heard that call, that invite to open your heart to God, to come into worship? When was the last time you shared that invite with someone else telling them of your excitement in knowing the grace and love of God? When was the last time you acknowledged the glory of God in your day or in someone else?

All those times are like that ringing bell, calling out to people to see the greatness of our Lord. When we hear the invite from others, when they share their faith, when they tell a story about what God has done for them, we are built up in our faith. The same thing happens when we share our own story with others: how God has changed us, describing what God is doing in our lives. Others are inspired, hearing of our excitement in the Lord. Recognizing God at work in others, expressing your gratitude for their faith, will inspire them to even greater devotion while deepening your connection in faith.

The church bell rings out, and so can we. Each of us can be the voice of God for others. Perhaps we won't do it in great speech or tremendous deeds of actions, but it may come in one single tone that rings out, breaking through the world to glorify God. May we all be that one single ring of the bell that shares the greatness of the glory of God and the hope that is everlasting.

Medication

As noted in April, we are collecting medications for Gary Laabs and his granddaughter to take to the Dominican Republic in late June.

In order to clear customs:

All medications should be brought in by May 25th

Because of luggage costs, we ask that medications fit MMI's guidelines:

- OTC medications should be **unopened**.
- Most needed are vitamins (**not gummy or prenatal**) and basic pain relievers.
- Prescription medications should be in their **original prescription container** with the label blacked out. These can be previously opened and partially used.
- All medications should have an expiration date of December 2025 or later.

Monetary Contributions

Monetary donations toward Gary's traveling costs should be marked as such on the *Other* line of your offering envelope.

Medical Info Cards

Gary will also once again take medication information cards. We now have enough greeting cards but can use help glueing the info cards together.


