Pastor's Ponderings

"Their life shall become
like a watered garden,
and they shall never

languish again."

Dear St. Mark:

Last month I shared in these "Pastor's Ponderings" the national church's new "Strategic Recommendations for the ELCA." It was a study done over several years using denominational statistics

and feedback of congregations relative to their experience in the American culture today. It draws up an overview of the five commitments that the church needs to follow through on if our denomination wants to be relevant in today's world. Even as this was a wonderful overview of the entire church and the culture of the United States, it was still lacking one thing: the emphasis on the individual member to develop and commit to their own faith.

The ELCA can set fine goals and mission statements, but unless the members individually are growing in their faith, in their dedication, in their commitment to the Lord, none of those grandiose plans will flourish. Without the body of the church – the members that individually make up the body of Christ – the denomination cannot and will not meet the needs of ministry today or tomorrow.

So, this month I wanted to ponder with you: how is your faith journey? Is it growing, being cultivated and developed? Or did you put it on hold, not really working at it, happy with the status quo? Or is it deteriorating, falling away, not even a thought crossing your mind? How would you describe your spiritual journey of faith in God?

Once you honestly answer that question, the next step would be to ask yourself if you want to change it for the better, improve it, develop it. If so, it only takes one little step. One simple move forward toward embracing God by reading scriptures, entering into a prayer routine, committing to weekly worship, entering into fellowship practice with other Christians in discussions of faith. It just takes developing those little steps of faith to improve your spiritual life.

It is like growing an abundantly producing tomato plant in your garden. You don't just go to the store and buy a tomato in the produce aisle and come home, plop it down in the yard, and hope that something is going to develop. It takes getting the basics right, beginning with the right seeds or a healthy seedling. Then working at the soil and getting the balance of nutrients just right, which means finding that place where you are fed spiritually, in worship, fellowship, or Bible study. When you have the right soil and the right seedling, then you need to nurture it, work at it, weeding out all that is bad, making sure it gets the good light and water that makes it strong. If you commit to these basic steps, just one step at a time, your faith can develop, flourish, and grow, never languishing again.

It is fine to say the national church has a five-level plan of ministry. But when it comes down to the health of the church, it all starts with you and me, doing our part in growing our faith, making the changes that are needed, and seeking to deepen our spiritual journey. May you begin that growth this summer.


HAPPENINGS AND NEWS IN OUR CONGREGATION
