As you learn more and more how God works, you will learn how to do your work... – COLOSSIANS 1:10

Think back to when you were a child. Imagine you're walking home from school. You see a pair of roller skates in the front yard of someone you don't know. You take the roller skates, bring them home and hide them under your bed. Your father discovers what you've done. What would his reaction be?

My father would have talked to me sternly about stealing, made me take back the skates and confess what I'd done to the neighbors, and grounded me for a few days.

What would *your* father have done? I've asked this question to dozens of people. And almost without exception, they knew with some assurance what their parent would do in the circumstance. "How do you know?" I asked them.

"Because we lived with him for years and saw and heard what he said and did about all kinds of situations and relationships."

I believe that's how we can learn to know God's will in specific situations. We surrender our lives to God, and as members of His family, we listen to Him in prayer every day, read His story in the Bible and see His values being lived out by Jesus. And we share our questions and our confessions with our brothers and sisters. Over time we absorb God's will, seeing and hearing His way of being honest and loving. And we come to know God's will in all kinds of situations, often without realizing it.
