It was a blazing hot day in 1904 at the Louisiana Purchase Exposition in St Louis, Missouri – a celebration marking the 100th anniversary of the purchase of the Louisiana Territory from France. Charles Menches was there at his ice cream stand. Like other ice cream vendors, he sold his treat in dishes. But he was so busy that by mid-morning all his dishes were gone. Customers were turning away, and his ice cream was melting.

Charles glanced around. Nearby, Ernest Hamwi from Syria was selling a Middle Eastern delicacy called *zalabia*, a crisp, pastry-like delight eaten with syrup.

"Quick," cried Menches, "give me some zalabia!" He curled the zalabia, scooped in the ice cream and handed each to a customer. They looked startled, tasted, then smiled. The ice cream was saved, and thus the ice cream cone was born!

What's the moral of this little story?

To me it's a reminder that problems and setbacks come to all of us. But God also gave us the qualities of imagination, originality and inventiveness. And who knows – perhaps He sometimes sends a challenging little setback just to make sure those qualities don't atrophy.
