And, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world... - MATTHEW 28:20

I like surprises, little unexpected things that pick me up on a lonely or difficult day. When I get home, I always look in the mailbox before opening the front door. I'm eager to know if I've received a letter from a friend. I'm thrilled when my hopes are fulfilled and disappointed when only bills greet me.

When I work at my computer, I fight the urge to pause and check my email. I want to find out if someone has reached across the expanse of cyberspace to contact me, to say hello, ask a question, share a thought.

The same thing is true in my spiritual life. I long to feel the presence of God. I often open my Bible seeking a "letter from God," a special word addressed to me. Early in the morning or late at night, I take long walks and talk aloud to my Creator. Many times it's a monologue, and I can only hear the sound of my own voice. But occasionally the monologue is transformed into a dialogue. I hear no heavenly voice, but I know that God is talking to me. And when that happens, it's a joyous surprise.

And so I guess I have a choice: I can sit and wait for others to communicate, or I can take the initiative and write the letter, flash the smile, give the gift or share the touch. Above all, I can faithfully talk to God, knowing that in His own good time He will speak to me.
