"The owner's servants came to him and said, 'Sir, didn't you sow good seed in your field? Where then did the weeds come from?" – MATTHEW 13:27

We'd been away on vacation for several weeks, so I was anxious to see how our yard had fared in the hot Florida Sun. I strolled through the yard, inspecting the shrubs and flower beds for progress or damage.

I was happy to discover that we'd had a lot of rain, so all the plants were healthy and growing. The roses were blooming, as were the vincas and hibiscus, and the Mexican petunias had grown another foot. Everything was flourishing...even the weeds.

I grabbed my gardening gloves and pruning shears and headed out to get rid of the intruders.

"Can I help?" asked Logan, my young grandson.
