Maggie was finally back in Connecticut for a third time, though the twenty-eight-day program was a bust. We had what appeared to be a viable plan for moving forward: she was going to a different therapeutic wilderness program, in Georgia. But she flat-out refused to go.

We were advised to hire a professional to transport her. Joe was our man. When he and his partner arrived at the hospital to pick up Maggie, she bellowed, howled, threatened, and ran around in a frenzy. After half an hour the nurse said, "We'll have to sedate her."

Joe frowned and shook his head. He believed his job consisted of more than just getting Maggie from Point A to Point B; he wanted to make her journey a positive one, a smooth transition. Force didn't fit into that.

"No," he said, "she can make the decision to come on her own." He asked the staff to back off and give her space. Then he turned to my daughter. "Take your time, Maggie. I believe you can do this. I can wait."

She stared, wild-eyed and trembling. Deep inside her terrified heart, she heard he'd stood up for her, trusted her.

A few moments passed. My fourteen-year-old finally took a deep breath and looked Joe in the eyes. Then she said, "I can do this. Let's go." And they did
