I've always believed that God's will is for peace on earth. Yet as I write this, there are wars going on in many places around the world. Sons and daughters, brothers and sisters, fathers and mothers are being killed every day, and when I watch the news, my heart aches for them and for their families.

I recently heard a speaker say, "Only about 10% of the soldiers in World War II actually aimed their shots at people. Most of them just shot in the enemy's direction. So the army started using dummies as targets on the rifle range to get soldiers used to shooting at other human beings."
