What? He knew her by name? I'd never even gotten her to meet my gaze.

Delilah glanced quickly at him and smiled; I almost dropped my fruit cup. Then he said, "I know you like bologna sandwiches, so I put one aside for you. Do you want mustard or mayonnaise?" She pointed decisively at the mayonnaise, and after asking if she'd like him to fix it for her and receiving a nod, he spread on the mayo and handed her the sandwich.

After smiling at him yet again, she walked away, clutching her special sandwich, her head held higher than ever before. Mine, on the other hand, hung low.
