This month we celebrate Pentecost, the coming of the Holy Spirit. That Spirit that came to the faithful and opened their minds to the Word of God and gave them knowledge beyond their means. May you also be open to the Spirit this month, may you ponder and dwell with the Lord in ever new ways.

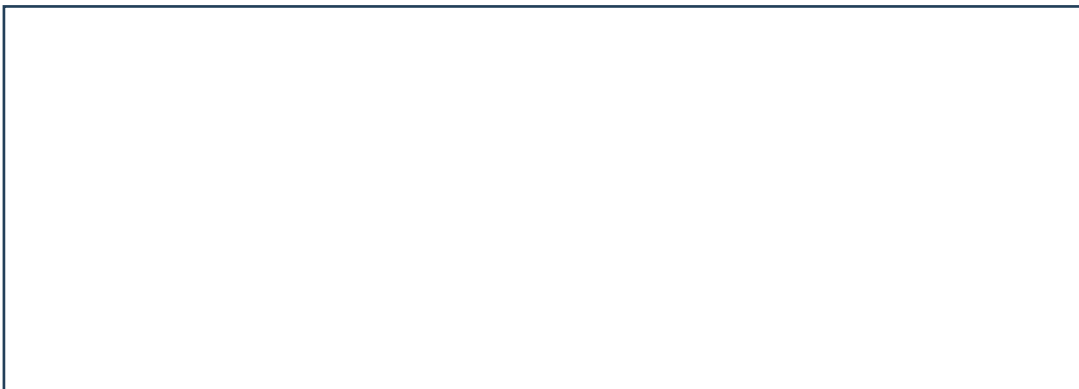
HAPPENINGS AND NEWS IN OUR CONGREGATION

Congregational Council Happenings – April 19th

- Council met on Sunday, April 19th, following morning worship, opening with prayer.
- Council commended everyone for being involved and lifting up worship in such wonderful ways during Easter and the Preschool/Youth Sunday. They also commended the recent fellowship times after worship with such great treats.
- Council accepted the minutes, attendance, and rolls.
- Thank you notes from Tender Care and from a member were reviewed.
- Council President Mike Merlo highlighted giving thanks to all our volunteers in the church who do so much in the ministry of God.
- Pastor gave his statistical report.
- Christian Education submitted a report reviewing Easter Egg hunt, Youth Sunday. Also mentioned the end of the Sunday School year and the upcoming VBS in July.
- Council reviewed Preschool Sunday and mentioned checking with the Preschool teachers about having more events that can combine the church and preschool families in ministry. Perhaps offering a “Messy Church” event again this fall for anyone wanting to attend.
- Sewing Group was commended for its continued work and dedication that each person puts in doing their own part, whether at home or on Thursday mornings in the sewing room.
- Under new business, the council voted to permit the UPMC Hospital Auxiliary to use the fellowship hall on September 16th, 17th, 18th, and 19th for a fundraiser Jewelry Sale.
- Council decided to have Pastor and Council President update the CPIC (Council Person in Charge) guidelines and expectations. Once completed, all Council members should have a review of these updated guidelines.
- It was noted that the St. Mark Facebook page is being updated frequently and that church Facebook members are encouraged to visit and share those updates with as many as they can, to help share the ministries and news of St. Mark with our community.
- Due to Pastor’s vacation, Council will suspend the May meeting and meet again on June 21st following morning worship. All are welcome to attend.

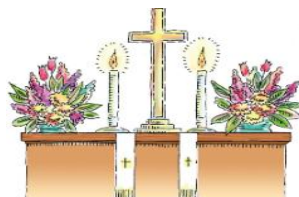

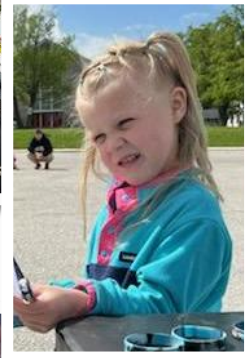

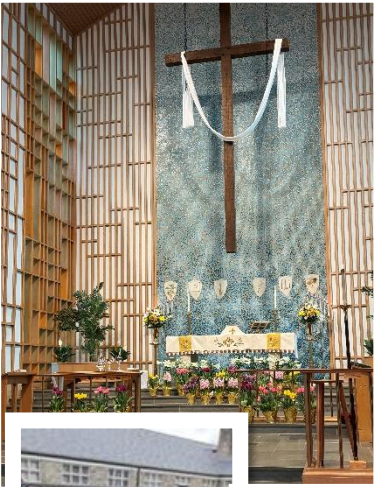


End of the School Year

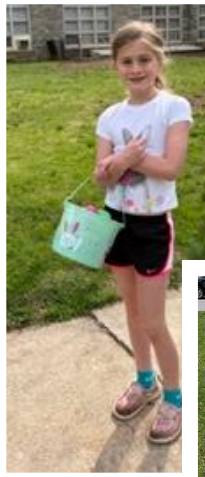
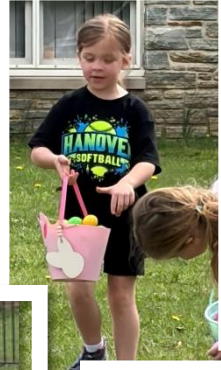
